

Stormwater Control Plan (SCP) FAQ:

1. How do I determine what stormwater requirements a project is subject to?
Take the **Stormwater Control Plan Survey** online at www.fremont.gov/stormwater. Answer 2 questions and the survey results will inform you exactly what stormwater requirements apply to the project.
2. What do I need to submit?
After you complete the survey, you will receive a project-type specific **Stormwater Control Plan (SCP) Checklist** which lists out items to be included in the plan set and items that need to be included as separate attachments which collectively make up the Stormwater Control Plan for the project.
3. Do you have instructions for putting together a SCP?
Yes! Check out the **Stormwater Control Plan Guidance Manual** available at: www.fremont.gov/stormwater which takes you from start to finish in putting together a SCP.
4. Is there a difference between a SCP in the entitlement phase (e.g. PLN) versus in the construction phase (e.g. BLD, SAM)?
Yes. The SCP Checklist you receive when completing the stormwater survey defines the requirements based on entitlement versus construction phase. During entitlement, a **Preliminary SCP (PSCP)** is reviewed and revised until deemed ready for entitlement and is so named **Approved PSCP**. During the construction phase, a SCP (grown from the Approved PSCP) is reviewed and revised until deemed ready for permit issuance and known as the **Final SCP**.
5. How should the SCP be submitted?
Digital submittal is highly encouraged and strongly preferred but not required at this time. Environmental Services is currently developing the mechanism for requiring digital submittal of the SCP.
6. Are there other changes we should expect?
Yes, in addition to digital submittal requirements, we are currently working on developing standard design details and guidance documents which will help streamline the review process. We also aim to add stormwater installation and inspection requirements to the SCP Guidance Manual in the future.
