WHAT IS THE CENTERVILLE COMPLETE STREETS PROJECT?

The Centerville Complete Streets project will implement "complete streets" improvements to segments of Fremont Boulevard (Alder Ave. to Eggers Dr.), Thornton Avenue (west of Fremont Blvd.), and Peralta Boulevard (Fremont Blvd. to Sequoia Rd.) to enhance safety and mobility for all users, including drivers, pedestrians, bicyclists, school children, and businesses. The project site is located in the heart of the Centerville commercial district and within close proximity to numerous schools, businesses, AC Transit bus lines, and the Centerville ACE/Amtrak train station.
