

Flashing Beacons


Flashing beacons are warning beacons installed at uncontrolled pedestrian crossings. Flashing beacons use a rapid flashing pattern to alert drivers when pedestrians are ready to cross.

As a motorist:

- Yield for pedestrians when a flashing beacon is activated.
- Stop behind the "sharksteeth" if they are marked.

As a pedestrian:

- You must use the push button to activate the flashing beacon.
- Make sure drivers are yielding before entering the crosswalk.
 Make eye contact with drivers.
