



# Apartment and Condominium Recycling Guide



Part of being a good neighbor is recycling and composting properly. Success depends on owners, managers and tenants working together to meet local laws.

**Property owners or managers** are required to provide the following for their tenants:

- Provide containers and subscribe to a sufficient service level for all recyclable and compostable materials.
- Provide signage on or near containers describing proper separation of recyclables and compostables.
- Provide information to tenants annually and no later than 14 days after they move in.

**Residents** are required to sort items properly.

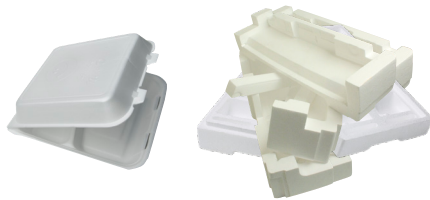

# Here's what you can do to make recycling a success at your building.

## Property owners or managers

### **Schedule a free on-site consultation**

Republic Services' Recycling Coordinator is available to come to your property, assess the site, and make recommendations for a successful program. Call 510-657-3500 to schedule.

### **Request free bins and outreach materials**

Republic Services offers kitchen pails for food scraps, posters, recycle bags, signs, and stickers at no charge. Place your request at 510-657-3500.

### **Get your tenants involved**

## Residents

### **Participate in your building's program**

Following the instructions in this guide, support your building's waste reduction programs by separating materials properly, and keeping recycling areas tidy. Request a free kitchen pail from property management for food scraps and food-soiled paper.

### **Alert management to problems**

If you notice issues such as improper sorting, overflowing containers, need for new signage, etc., notify your property management so problems can be corrected quickly.
