G. Labor Cost for Employees

- Planning and Engineering staff: Base salary of each staff member performing work times the multiplier specified in the annual operating budget.
- Other City staff: Labor cost for employee time provided for services for which charges are not otherwise specified in other sections of the Fee Resolution is the employee salary and benefits plus citywide and departmental overhead as shown in the current Billing Pay Schedule.

Labor costs will be prorated per hour in 15 minute increments or multiples thereof, with a minimum charge of \$15.00 for a cash transaction. If the City must invoice to obtain payment, the minimum charge will be \$35.00.

H. Development Services Billing Process

Development Services Billing Process: Applicants submitting land use planning applications or seeking real property development services and permits, including persons requesting appeals on development applications reviewed for conformance with FMC Titles 12, 17, and 18, must submit a deposit based on the estimated amount of time for review of an application, including appeals. The required deposit amounts are provided in Article II, *Development – Planning, Engineering, and Building & Safety*. The required deposit amounts for appeals are provided in section I.P, *Appeals to City Council/Commissions/Committees*.

Billing invoices will be mailed during the review of the deposit-based application, including appeals, if charges exceed the deposit. If costs exceed the deposit, the deposit must be replenished when prompted to do so by City staff. Prompt payment of invoices will ensure continued processing of the application, including appeals. Unpaid invoices are considered late after 30 days of non-payment. Non-payment of billed charges may result in any of the following actions until outstanding charges are paid in full:

- 1. Temporary cessation of processing of the application, including appeals;
- 2. Withholding final action on an application, including appeals;
- 3. Cessation of work on all project-related applications, including appeals, and actions including engineering, landscape, building, or planning inspection of the work;
- A determination that any application, including any appeal, has been withdrawn without prejudice and closure of the file;
- 5. Outstanding invoices being sent to a City designated collection agency; or
- 6. Withholding of any approval documentation/subsequent processing of applications until full payment is received

The City reserves the right to offset any shortages in other accounts by the same applicant or billing party. See introduction to Article II, *Development – Planning, Engineering, and Building & Safety*, for additional information about the policies and procedures regulating the deposit-based applications.

II. DEVELOPMENT - PLANNING, ENGINEERING, AND BUILDING & SAFETY

Development fees are a combination of many different fee bases, such as job cost (deposit), flat, valuation, hourly, and others as listed in this section. Where identified, deposits required for job cost fees must be paid with the submittal of an application. The City's policies and administrative procedures for these deposits are established in City Council Resolution No. 2010-23, *Land Use and Development Service Deposits*, adopted April 13, 2010. Pursuant to this resolution, the deposit amounts are adjusted administratively and are updated from time to time based on the average cost to process the various application types. The deposit amounts below are provided as a convenience to applicants. However, applicants are encouraged to confirm deposit amounts with City staff prior to submittal. - b) Includes distinguished architectural features or exceptional design elements;
- c) Is characterized by above average quality standard finishes;
- d) Is well located relative to the needs of major tenant sectors in the marketplace;
- e) Is served by state of art building systems (e.g., mechanical, HVAC, elevator and utility);
- f) Has building services that are characterized by above-average maintenance and upkeep; and
- g) Offers ample, easily available and convenient designated parking and/or access to rail transit sufficient to meet the needs of tenants and visitors during typical business hours.

Examples locally include: Office buildings at Civic Center Drive/Walnut Avenue.

"Headquarters Office" shall mean an office facility and any adjoining facilities that serve as the primary office of the multi-state, regional (e.g., West Coast), or national company.

"Advanced manufacturing space" shall mean a whole or hybrid space that incorporates or supports:

- a) The use of innovative technology/high precision equipment to improve products or processes; or
- b) New business or management methodologies in fields such as high technology products and processes or flexible manufacturing. Examples locally include: Delta, Lam Research.

As used herein:

- a) "High technology products and processes" means advanced, new, and innovative products and processes.
- b) "Flexible manufacturing" means a manufacturing process capable of furnishing a diverse mix of products in small or large volumes with both the efficiency of mass production and the flexibility of custom manufacturing in order to respond quickly to customer demand.

The Community Development Director shall have discretion to determine whether a use constitutes advanced or traditional manufacturing, and in resolving any ambiguities shall give consideration to the definitions and examples of advance manufacturing provided in the April 2016 report of the Subcommittee for Advanced Manufacturing of the National Science and Technology Counsel, entitled *Advanced Manufacturing:* A Snapshot of Priorities Areas Across the Federal Government, and available for reference here: Advanced Manufacturing: A Snapshot of Priority Technology Areas Across the Federal Government | Manufacturing USA.

Reserved Park Area open space shall be designated on the Facility Use Permit as a circle of 100 foot radius centered on some identifiable park feature (31,400 sf), shall not occupy or cross any pedestrian pathway, sidewalk, or vehicle parking area and shall not coincide with any other reserved park area or distinct park activity feature (i.e. playground, sports field or public toilet building). Reserved Park Area open space requiring greater area than that identified above shall be designated, reserved and charged in multiple increments of the area defined above.

D. Cost Covering Programs

Registration fees are published in the City's Recreation Guide. Fees are set to cover all direct costs such as instructors, materials and contracted services, plus overhead allocations. City costs include programming and the use of City facilities. When applicable, \$5 is added to the rate when participants are non-residents. If an activity is canceled by the City prior to commencement, pre-paid registration fees shall be refunded. If a registrant withdraws before an activity commences, for circumstances beyond the registrant's reasonable control, pre-paid registration fees may be refunded, less a \$10 service charge which will be retained by the City.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF USE FOR RECREATION SERVICES

- 1 Group III Users: May use facilities Monday through Thursday, 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., and Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (excluding holidays) on an on-going reservation basis at \$25/hr fee for a small meeting room, \$36/hr fee for a small multi-purpose room, and \$67/hr fee for a main hall/large multi-purpose room. Gymnasiums and Downtown Event Center are excluded.
- 2 Non-refundable Application Fee: a non-refundable application fee shall be charged for all Group VI, Group VII, Fundraiser, Special Events and uses that include unusual requests, in addition to hourly user fees and staff costs as appropriate. Application fee will be applied to total charges only if use is approved.
- 3 Advanced Time Waiver/Park and Picnic: Groups requesting permits in advance of the stated reservation period will be assessed a time-waiver surcharge of 50%. Stated reservation periods for non-residents is 60 days in advance of the day of use. For resident groups, either community or private groups, the reservation period starts on February 1 of each year. A policy exists whereby a minimum of one major picnic area will either be in use or reserved at all times for use by Fremont groups.
- Sportsfields: All non-routine litter pickup and/or damage repairs will be charged to the permittee at actual cost to the City (ACC).
- 5 Soccer/Football Fields: Soccer/football fields are to be used for scheduled League or Tournament play only. Soccer/football use is by permit. Due to maintenance considerations, permits will not be issued for practice use.
- 6 Advance Time Waiver/Tennis Tournaments: Tournament reservations may be made up to 60 days in advance of the first reserved day. The 60-day reservation period may be waived for a time-waiver surcharge of 50%.
- Advance Time Waiver/Athletic Tournaments: Tournament reservations may be made in advance up to 30 days for non-resident and 60 days for private resident use. This reservation period may be waived for a time-waiver surcharge of 50%.
- 8 Cleaning and Damage Deposits: Deposits up to \$275 may be made/assigned on all facility, equipment and park use. Any unused funds will be refunded at the end of the season or event. (Performance Bonds may be required for major events.) The Downtown Event Center (DEC) will charge a deposit of \$750 for any buyouts, \$500 for a normal room rental, & \$250 for a Plaza Rental.
- Teen Center Use Priorities: First priority is given to City operated teen programs; second priority is given to teen related rentals; third priority is given to other general City recreation programs and fourth priority is given to general rental use.
- 10 Use by Other Governmental Jurisdictions: Governmental agencies that provide reciprocal use of their facilities to City recreation programs at no charge shall be subject to classification as a Group II user. Governmental agencies that do not provide free use of their facilities shall be charged the Group III non-profit use rate.
- 11 Primetime Use: Primetime is Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. Resident non-profit groups use will be charged the Group IV resident rate during Primetime.
- Advance Block Rate: Resident non-profit youth organizations may reserve a minimum 10-hour block of use on synthetic turf fields at the Advance Block Rate fee. Resident adult non-profit cricket organizations may reserve a minimum 25-hour block of use on Central Park Cricket/Soccer Fields 9 & 10 (only) at the Advanced Block Rate. Advance Block Rate fees must be paid in full in advance at the time of reservation. A minimum of 2 hours per reservation must be booked in order to qualify for the Advanced Block Rate.
- 13 Discounts for Large Group Picnic Areas with Catering Package: The Director of Community Services or Designee can offer up to a 20% discount off the approved Central Park Group Picnic Area fees for any rental if they book a package that also includes City catering services.
- Annual CPI-U Increases: The Director of Community Services can authorize annual cost of service changes in order to tie to the most recently published Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), San Francisco Bay Area index for the Master Fee Schedule. Annual rate changes, if any, are published on the City's website at www.fremont.gov and become effective on July 1.
 Rate changes on 7/1/24 were based upon an index of 3.8% (May 1, 2023 thru April 30, 2024).
- 15 Downtown Event Center Bundles: Includes: entire building, outdoor patio, dance floor, use of the cocktail tables and a 10% discount. Bundles do not include Downtown Plaza exclusive use, but it may be added for the listed rental fee.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF USE FOR ANIMAL SERVICES

- 1 Two or three year pet licenses are purchased by pet owners at a reduced fee at their option and, therefore, are not refundable in whole or in part, nor will credit be allowed toward licenses for other pets.
- ² Pet owners presenting a receipt from a veterinarian clinic or municipal animal shelter for prepayment of a spay or neuter operation for their pet will be allowed to purchase a one year license at the spay/neuter rate.
- 3 Late penalty shall be assessed when pet license is not renewed within thirty (30) days following expiration, when unlicensed dog/cat has been in the City of Fremont for more than thirty (30) days, when a pet license has not been purchased within thirty (30) days following the rabies vaccination.
- 4 California law requires municipal animal shelters to collect a deposit for rabies vaccination for each dog adopted. Rabies vaccination fee subject to change dependent on fees charged by local veterinarians.
- ⁵ Explanation of References
 - (a) Fees listed are the minimum charge. Actual fees will be computed at the cost of labor plus overhead and/or cost of materials involved in providing the services.
 - (b) Animal boarding charges will be levied for each overnight stay including days in which the animal shelter is not open to the public.
 - (c) When an injured stray animal is taken to a veterinarian for treatment, boarding charges start as of the date of impound. If the owner is initially unknown, but identified later, all charges will be assessed against the owner.
- ⁶ Animal Permit and Potentially Dangerous Dog License delinquency fees shall be assessed when each permit license renewal fee is not received by the City within thirty (30) days following expiration.
- ⁷ Fee may not represent full City cost, such as, medical, boarding, euthanasia, transportation, etc. in providing this service.
- Fluorescent rabies anti-body test conducted by Alameda County Health Department shall be charged to pet owner and will be subject to change based on County's fees.
- ⁹ Fee provides initial processing and one property inspection. Additional inspections or City services will be billed at actual cost of labor plus overhead and/or cost of materials involved in providing the service.
- ¹⁰ Plus four (4) days of required boarding will be charged in addition to the Owner Surrendered Fee.
- ¹¹ There will also be a charge for the appropriate License Fee.

PUBLIC SAFETY FIRE PERMIT FEE GUIDELINES:

- 1. Payment Due Dates:
 - a. Hazardous Materials Management Initial Compliance Review fee due at the time a facility is first notified by the City they must comply with Fremont's Hazardous Materials Management Ordinance and every year thereafter until a Hazardous Materials Permit is issued. This fee has been established to cover the costs of identifying a non-complying facility and reasonable staff time invested to bring such facility into compliance with Fremont's Hazardous Materials Management Ordinance
 - b. Annual fees are due by the permit date of each year. Annual fees are due for all qualifying facilities which are in substantial compliance with Fremont's Hazardous Materials Management Ordinance.
- 2. Facility Ranges are set forth as follows:
 - a. Range 1 (for facilities not exempted or excluded under FMC Chapter 8.35): Up to and including the aggregate quantity of 55 gallons for liquids, 500 pounds for solids, and 200 cubic feet at STP of compressed gas(es).
 - b. Range 2: Aggregate quantities between 55 and 550 gallons for liquids, 500 and 5,000 pounds for solids, and 200 and 2,000 cubic feet at standard pressure and temperature of compressed gas(es).
 - c. Range 3: Aggregate quantities between 550 and 2,750 gallons for liquids, 5,000 and 25,000 pounds for solids, and 2,000 and 10,000 cubic feet at standard pressure and temperature of compressed gas(es).
 - d. Range 4: Aggregate quantities between 2,750 and 5,500 gallons for liquids, 25,000 and 50,000 pounds for solids, and 10,000 and 20,000 cubic feet at STP of compressed gas(es).
 - e. Range 5: Aggregate quantities between 5,500 and 20,000 gallons for liquids, 50,000 and 200,000 pounds for solids, and 20,000 and 80,000 cubic feet at STP of compressed gas(es).
 - f. Range 6: Aggregate quantities between 20,000 and 80,000 gallons for liquids, 200,000 and 600,000 pounds for solids, and 80,000 and 300,000 cubic feet at STP for gas(es).
 - g. Range 7: Aggregate quantities between 80,000 and 160,000 gallons for liquids, 600,000 and 1,200,000 pounds for solids, and 300,000 and 600,000 cubic feet at STP for gas(es).
 - h. Range 8: Aggregate quantities between 160,000 and 320,000 gallons for liquids, 1,200,000 and 2,400,000 pounds for solids, and 600,000 and 1,200,000 cubic feet at STP for gas(es).
 - i. Range 9: Aggregate quantities between 320,000 and 640,000 gallons for liquids, 2,400,000 and 4,800,000 pounds for solids, and 1,200,000 and 2,400,000 cubic feet at STP for gas(es).
 - j. Range 10: Aggregate quantities over 640,000 gallons for liquids, 4,800,000 pounds for solids, and 2,400,000 cubic feet at STP for gas(es).
