

Exterior Elevated Elements Exemption Declaration Form

State law requires regular inspections and associated reports of exterior elevated elements that include load-bearing components in all buildings containing three or more multifamily dwelling units by the property owner or the board of an association of a condominium property. See Health & Safety Code § 17973 and Civil Code § 5551.

Property owners or representatives of condominium association boards may complete this declaration only if the exterior elevated elements inspection and report requirements of Health & Safety Code § 17973 and Civil Code § 5551 do not apply to the property.

To submit this form, please fill it out completely. Then, print, sign, scan, and submit it to Code Enforcement by <u>email</u>.

Submitting this form will remove the property from the City's inventory of buildings subject to exterior elevated elements laws.
