Key Numbers



Rate Fremont as an "excellent" or "good" place to live (down 7% from 2016)



Feel housing costs in Fremont are an "extremely" or "very" serious problem (+13% from 2016)



Feel the rate of growth and development in Fremont is "too fast" (+19% from 2016)



Have heard anything about changes to City Council representation



Methodology

- 705 interviews with Fremont residents
- Conducted June 20-July 3, 2018, online and via landline and cell phones in English, Spanish and Mandarin
- Respondents were invited to participate via email, phone or a postcard
- Margin of sampling error of +/-4.0% at the 95% confidence interval
- Due to rounding, some percentages do not add up to 100%
- Selected comparisons to prior research in the city




Research Approach

- Residents were asked a series of questions assessing their attitudes about quality of life in Fremont, tracking changes over several years.
- Many questions examine attitudes about growth and development and accountability and openness of City government.
- Residents were also asked how much they value certain city services, and then how satisfied they are with each service.
- This year's survey also included some new, more-specific questions about public safety, homelessness, and the shift to district City Council elections.

As Fremont prepares to shift to district elections for City Council, we examined many questions by resident district.












Life in Fremont

More than seven in ten call Fremont a good place to live, though there has been some erosion in the share who rate it "excellent."


How would you rate the City of Fremont as a place to live: is it an excellent place to live, a good place to live, just average, poor, or an extremely poor place to live?






Seven in ten residents in each CCD view life in Fremont as "excellent" or "good," though with different levels of intensity.

Indian and Pakistani residents give higher ratings than those of other ethnicities.






Residents are less optimistic about where the City and their neighborhoods are heading.

Voters in District 1 are most optimistic about the city and their neighborhoods generally.







Strong majorities still agree the city is a great place to raise a family, and diversity is an asset, but do so less strongly than in the past.






Three in ten say Fremont is *not* a great place for seniors and aging residents to live.




Fremont is a great place for seniors and aging residents to live.






As in many Bay Area cities, traffic congestion and housing costs are broadly shared concerns.

Traffic and housing have become much stronger concerns than in prior years.










Attitudes about Safety


Majorities feel safe generally and as pedestrians.

Over the past few years do you feel the <u>overall level of crime</u> in Fremont has increased or decreased?





Just under half believe violent crime has increased; a similar share see no difference.


Over the past few years do you feel the level of <u>violent</u> crime in Fremont has increased or decreased?





Two-thirds believe that property crime has increased over the last several years.


Over the past few years do you feel the level of <u>property</u> crime, such as burglaries, in Fremont has increased or decreased?





With or without an explanation, relatively few are familiar with the Vision Zero Action Plan.








Homelessness

Nearly half believes that homelessness could be improved – but not solved.


Would you say homelessness is a problem that could be solved, a problem that could be improved but <u>not</u> solved, or a problem that is unlikely to improve?

Which of the following is the <u>most</u> important reason for you personally to want homelessness in Fremont to be addressed?










Growth and Development

The share who believe the city is growing too quickly has increased sharply, to two-thirds.


Do you think the rate of growth and development in Fremont is too fast, about right, or too slow?

Perceptions of Fremont Rate of Growth by Length of Fremont Residence



Though still generally viewed positively, residents are more divided on the quality of life impacts of the downtown and Warm Springs projects.








Attitudes toward City Government

Residents give consistently positive ratings to the City on providing services.


How would you rate the overall job being done by Fremont City government in providing services to the City's residents: excellent, good, only fair, or poor?

Assessing City Services


- Residents were asked about the importance of 21 City services.

Public safety, waste services, parks and roads are among residents' top priorities.



Also broadly important are priorities like dealing with homelessness.



Less-urgent priorities include bike lanes, attracting new businesses, and graffiti removal.



Residents are most satisfied with emergency response and waste services.



They are also largely satisfied with recreation programs and road maintenance.






Satisfaction with some items has declined, largely driven by an increasing share that is unfamiliar. (Total Satisfied)




Many of the most important priorities are also the ones residents are satisfied with.





Removing those uninformed about services highlights homeless and street services.












Perceptions of the City Budget

More feel unfamiliar with the City's budget management...


How would you rate the overall job the City of Fremont does managing its budget: excellent, good, only fair, or poor?

Would you say that to maintain essential services, the City of Fremont has a great need for additional funding, some need, a little need, or no real need for additional funding?













Election Changes

Three-quarters of Fremont residents are unfamiliar with the change to district elections.

Have you seen, read or heard about upcoming changes to the way Fremont voters elect their City Council representatives?








Two in five know that members will be elected by district — two-thirds don't know.




Three in five (62%) of those who say they are familiar with the changes know it is a shift to districts.



Nearly all residents are unaware of which district they are in.

Conclusions

Conclusions

- While there has been some erosion on many metrics of quality of life, residents overall are still quite satisfied with life in Fremont.
- Concerns with housing costs, traffic and the pace of growth are paramount – as in many Bay Area and West Coast cities – and likely driving some of this change in attitudes.
- On the City services and programs residents care about most, such as public safety, trash pick-up and parks, the City's satisfaction ratings are quite good.
- Large majorities feel safe in the city, though many have the sense that property crime has increased over the years.
- Homelessness is an important concern for residents, driven by concern about the well-being of people on the street, and most are optimistic that the issue could at least be improved.
- Few are familiar with the change to district council elections, and many are not especially confident that the City works openly and accountably.
